



Overview

The **MIRAD's Task A2.1** was to create a database of NGOs that work with extremist/radical individuals, or with those who are potentially vulnerable to engage in radical activities and, therefore, be in danger of initiating their radicalisation process. This database aims to be as comprehensive as possible, including NGOs from EU countries outside of the MIRAD partnership. **The database includes 152 organisations and initiatives from across Europe** (EU member states as well as Switzerland, Albania, Kosovo, Serbia, Montenegro, Bosnia and Herzegovina and Russia). MIRAD's Knowledgeable, Experienced, and Skilled (KES) Consultative Council was formed from the database's pool of organisations, with the responsibility of assisting in the thorough conceptualisation and validation of the project's tools.

Methodology

Phase 0



A discussion was held about the task's organisational aspects and the indicators that would be used.

Phase 1



In accordance with the consortium's agreement, a desk research was conducted to identify relevant organisations.

Phase 2



The identified organisations' databases were uploaded.

The ideal NGO selection had to meet the following criteria:

Obtaining European-wide coverage

Having relevant experience

Inclusion of NGOs of various sizes

The NGO Database

The database was developed in collaboration with IPS and was co-implemented online in a unique networking platform called Corrections Direct - The Global Prisons and Probation Directory. This platform brings together prison and probation administrations, specialised suppliers, experts, and penitentiary research organisations. The platform's goal is to bring all stakeholders together in a single, easily searchable directory, as well as to promote connections and partnership opportunities among community members.

CORRECTIONS Direct, which currently has over 1400 members, provides a wide range of functionalities to agencies and organisations looking for connections or visibility. They can participate by including information about their work in their profiles, publishing community articles or videos, and posting events to the shared calendar.
